Orsova City



Orsova is a port city on the Danube river in the southwestern region of Romania, in Mehedinti County. The city is located in the Banat historical region and it was a Roman port in Dacia Malvensis, and the site of a castrum named Dierna. It is situated just above the Iron Gates, on the spot where Cerna River meets Danube.



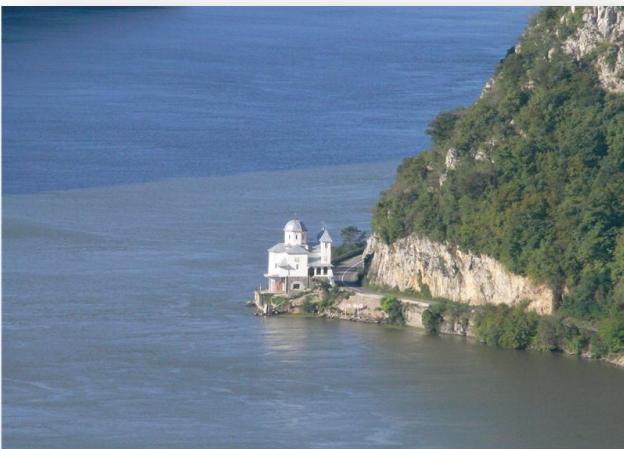

Tricule Fortress was built in the XVth century in order to stop the Otoman expansion to West. Its ruins can be observed near Svinita locality. Only three towers are visible because at the beginning of the last century, the ice on the Danube destroyed it and what was left was covered by the waters of Danube River.



The Iron Gates

The Iron Gates is a gorge on Danube River, lying between Romania in the north and Serbia in the south. It encompasses a route of 134 km (83 miles) but in the narrow sense it only encloses the last barrier on this route, just beyond Orșova, containing two hydroelectric dams, with two power stations, Iron Gate I Hydroelectric Power Station and Iron Gate II Hydroelectric.
